On Sunday, July the second the M.S.C.A.V. lost its Club Captain John Peter Burford, killed in a tragic accident at Rokeby.

John had been a member of the Association for just over twelve months and in a short space of time had become one of our most popular members. I do not think the Association has had a more dedicated captain than John, who never travelled anywhere with the Association but on his motor cycle or scooter. John was undoubtedly the easiest going member in the Association and never once can I recall him having argued about anything or complain when things went wrong.

The Association has lost a fine member and a very good friend.

The Loss Of A Member

Saturday July 1st.

Four members left Melbourne and headed for Warrigal, where they were accommodated at a motel for the night. The weather during the journey was fine but began to rain during the evening, but this didn't worry them as they were in high spirits and occupied themselves by making plans for similar outings in the future.

At 9:00am the following morning, in fine weather and the prospect of a good day ahead of them, they departed from the motel intending to journey to Mt Baw Baw, where they intended to meet the official convoy. However on rounding a curve just past the town of Rokeby tragedy struck when the third member of the convoy Johnny Burford, was involved in a collision with a truck travelling in the opposite direction. The impact threw John from his cycle which resulted in the loss of his life. A second collision then occurred in which the truck and the fourth member of the convoy were involved and as a result Kevin Nye was seriously injured and is now recovering in hospital.

Wednesday 5.

The cortege was met outside of Dandenong, and escorted to the cemetery by six fellow Honda riders. Over fifty people paid their respects at the service, which was held at the Springvale Lawn Cemetery. The coffin bearers were Robert Jellett, Greg Smith, Alan Shafto and Bruce Higgs. Peter Philferan spoke at the grave side on behalf of the Association, expressing our deep sorrow on the loss of a good friend and club Captain.
