THE NEW COMPETITION

Named: "SCOOTERING SET!"

This competition will be run for a period of six months, at the end of this period the member scoring the most points will be awarded a trophy which will be in his or her possession for the following six months. The Scootering Set will then recommence.

For your information the competition has already begun it started at the May Social! This will finalise the first Scootering Set for the October Annual Elections. Thus allowing outgoing committee members participation in the second Scootering Set.

As you will no doubt see, if you read on, you will be awarded points for the various club activities in which you participate set out below is the points system:-

For new scootering or light motor cycling members – male 10pts – female – 11pts.

Attendance for the Saturday morning roster system -2pts per time.

Articles submitted for Whispers -5 points per article.

Suggestions placed in the suggestion box – 5pts per run, 10pts per improvement of the Association.

Attendance on OFFICIAL club functions – 2pts per time.

Efforts in competitions, not including Scootering Set -1^{st} place $3pts-2^{nd}$ place $2pts-3^{rd}$ place 1pt.

Janitor duties at socials – 1pt for each duty completed.

Now there you have it, but just to confuse the issue we the committee have a set of rules by which you must abide, these are listed below:-

To obtain points for new members you must accompany the new member on paying of his or her first subscription.

For the Saturday morning roster system you must have your name placed on the roster sheet.

Points for articles submitted to the Whispers shall only be awarded if the article appears in the magazine. The choice of articles shall be decided by the Editors.

Suggestions you are eligible for points only if the suggestion is used during the Scootering Set in which they are submitted.

Attendance on official functions (those which appear on the itinerary) members shall be entitled to only half the amount of points awarded for attendance if they arrive independent of the official convoy to the destination started on the itinerary.

If a member does not bring supper to the general meetings he or she shall be entitled to only half of the attendance points.

A possible member shall be entitled to points during his or her probationary period.

Remember you must check in to ensure that you have received attendance points, if this is not done the committee cannot be responsible for any lost points.

Any person fined for a breach of road rules will have this stared on his or her membership record.

If you travel on a run by means other than m/scooter or light m/cycle you shall be entitled to only half of the attendance points, but this will be subject to the discretion of the committee.

The Scootering Set may be contested by all financial members with the exception of committee members.

The winning members of the Scootering Set will be decided by the committee and members records will be taken into account if there is a tie for first, second and third place.

As stated previously the winning member will receive a trophy which he or she will hold for a period of six months, he or she shall also receive a certificate (to be held permanently) and if the committee judges it is warranted the member shall be awarded a MERRIT STRIPE.

Second and third place getters shall be presented with certificates, to be held by them permanently.

Well that's about it, so from the committee good luck and remember progress reports will appear in the Whispers.
