Who's News October 2011

Club Membership stands at 69. One renewal this month – Ben Fuller after the Towong Epic.

The Club web site at www.melbsportsbike.net.au accumulated 477 hits during October, down 219 on last month – potentially due to the generally cool to cold and wet weather and the MotoGP at Phillip Island providing competition. Total site visits are 71, 631 since April 1996. The counters on the other pages after another month indicate that the 2011 Ride Calendar page took 437 hits (total 19,393 since 28th October 2008) and Great Roads 130 hits (total 4939).

For October, the official kilometres (sum of ride lengths) for the month is **3,369 km** (up1,186km on last month – Towong at 2120km the big ticket ride). Official Club kilometres for the month (people x ride length) is **43,181**, up 21,725 on last month – Towong boosting numbers. The 2011 year total is **323,632** km; the average calendar yearly total is 327,813 since 2005. The people km per injury for 2011 is **46,233 km** – another few crashes this month denting the average; long term it is 85,516 km per (serious) injury.

The count is for the 2011/12 year ending the ride before the 2012 AGM in July. After **four** months the top ten positions are: **Ben Warden** (27), **Pina Garasi** (26), **Ron Johnston** (21.5), **Marc Marais** (21), **Paul Southwell** (19), **Robert Langer** (19), **Ian Payne** (16.5), **Tony Stegmar** (15), **Misho Zrakic** (14), and **Tim Emons** (13). Again lots of movement this month with Ben squeezing past Pina for the lead, Ron jumping a couple of places and Marc moving up another place at the expense of Paul.
