Who's News January 2012

Club Membership stands at 74, one up from last month. Welcome to **Aiden Baker** riding a Kawasaki ER6-N. He is a personal trainer so should be up to the rigours of our rides. We wish him many happy, safe and fun rides. Please have a chat with him on your next ride.

The Club web site at www.melbsportsbike.net.au accumulated 534 hits during January, up 64 on last month. Total site visits are 73,175 since April 1996. The counters on the other pages after another month indicate that the 2012 Ride Calendar page took 438 hits (total 20,706 since 28th October 2008) and Great Roads 113 hits (total 5367).

For <u>January</u>, the official kilometres (sum of ride lengths) for the month is **3,894 km** (down 843 km on last month – Xmas Camp at 2273 km the big ticket ride last month distorting the monthly totals). Official Club kilometres for the month (people x ride length) is **49,960** up 11,016 on last month. Lots of rides with high participation rates during January inflate the figures.

The <u>2011</u> year total was **387,875** km; the average calendar yearly total is 336,393 since 2005, so we did an extra 50,000 km last year. The people km per injury for 2011 was **55,411 km** - 2011 was well down on the long term average of 102,381 km per (serious) injury. The <u>2012</u> January total is **49,960** people km with no injuries.

The **Club Participant of the Year** is based on aggregate points accumulated at 1 point per ride, an extra point for leading or being rear rider, and 1 point per magazine article (maximum 2 per magazine). Attending one or more days of a weekend event scores 3 points for leading, 3 for rear riding duties and 2 points for participating.

The count is for the 2011/12 year ending the ride before the 2012 AGM in July. After seven months the top ten positions are: **Ben Warden** (57), **Pina Garasi** (40.5), **Ron Johnston** (40.5), **Marc Marais** (36), **Rob Langer** (35), **Ian Payne** (34.5), **Paul Southwell** (34), **Tony Stegmar** (33.5), **Tim Emons** (25), and **Misho Zrakic** (24). The same top ten, but some reshuffling of the order: Rob jumped a couple of places, Ian moved past Paul and Tim moved past Misho. Pina and Ron are neck and neck, tied for second place.

VicRoads put a flyer in the paper back in November: "From 21 November 2011 motorcycles and scooters will be permitted to use the Hoddle Street bus lane southbound between the Eastern Freeway off-ramp and Victoria Parade Collingwood. This trial will conclude in mid-2012 and will assess travel times and other benefits for motorcycles. The trial will also collect feedback from the community and consider any impacts on buses and other road users.
