Perhaps when explaining the Corner Marking System the leader should elaborate on the "look carefully for corner markers" in addition to "how to corner mark"? We arrived in Woodend shortly after and had lunch. Changes to the route so as not to end up out in Werribee, far from most riders' homes, were discussed. We were eager to avoid any long stretches of boring freeway, especially in the 37 degree heat. Geoff decided to lead us to Trentham Falls where we walked halfway down the steps and had a look.

After the pleasant break the ride continued on to Blackwood, Greendale and Bacchus Marsh for fuel. Then on to Riddells Creek, Clarkefield and Bulla, finishing on the exciting Wildwood Road under the Tullamarine airport flight path.
