Who's News March 2012

Club Membership stands at 76. No crashes for the month. – the second in a row.

The Club web site at www.melbsportsbike.net.au accumulated 445 hits during February, down 89 on last month. Total site visits are 73,620 since April 1996. The counters on the other pages after another month indicate that the 2012 Ride Calendar page took 377 hits (total 21,083 since 28th October 2008) and Great Roads 93 hits (total 5460).

For <u>February</u>, the official kilometres (sum of ride lengths) for the month is **1,343 km** (down 2551 km on last month – no weekends away). Official Club kilometres for the month (people x ride length) is **16,702** down 33,258 on last month.

The average calendar yearly total is 336,393 km since 2005. This year we are up to 66,662 km with no injuries.

The same top ten, but some minor reshuffling of the order: Ron slipped past Pina into second position and Rob Langer is now equal with Marc Marais.
