Who's News April 2012

Club Membership stands at 86, up 2 on last month. Welcome to new member Richard Paulsen riding a Kawasaki 650R and welcome back to Michael Srb on his Suzuki GSXR1000.

The Club web site at www.melbsportsbike.net.au accumulated 569 hits during April, down 93 on last month. Total site visits are 74,851 since April 1996. The counters on the other pages after another month indicate that the 2012 Ride Calendar page took 536 hits (total 22,231 since 28th October 2008) and Great Roads 99 hits (total 5684).

For <u>April</u>, the official kilometres (sum of ride lengths) for the month is **2,070 km** (down 1558 km on last month which had 7 rides). Official Club kilometres for the month (people x ride length) is **22,940**, down 23,446 on last month – loaded with weekends away.

The average calendar yearly total is 336,393 km since 2005. This year we are up to **135,998** km with only minor injuries, all incurred last month.

The **Club Participant of the Year** is based on aggregate points accumulated at 1 point per ride, an extra point for leading or being rear rider, and 1 point per magazine article (maximum 2 per magazine). Attending one or more days of a weekend event scores 3 points for leading, 3 for rear riding duties and 2 points for participating.

The count is for the 2011/12 year ending the ride before the 2012 AGM in July. After ten months the top ten positions are: Ben Warden (87), Pina Garasi (56), Rob Langer (53), Ron Johnston (52), Marc Marais (51), Ian Payne (50.5), Paul Southwell (47), Tony Stegmar (34.5), Tim Emons (33), and Misho Zrakic (32). The same top ten, but some minor reshuffling of the order: Ron dropped another position down to fourth. It is still very close between Ron, Rob and Marc.

Email from **Pierre Ong** on 11th April: Just giving you an update on my recent crash on the Dargo ride. I was able to walk away suffering deep lacerations to my left elbow, bruising to right hand, contusion of the chest and shoulder. The GP at Bairnsdale removed a substantial amount of gravel and rock from my left arm. Unfortunately it became infected two days later and I was taken to Emergency department, placed on an IV drip. The plastic surgeon decided to operate and I spent the next few days in hospital. Out of hospital now and will have a nurse visit me over the next few weeks to attend to the wound. It's a deep laceration and has to heal from the inside requiring repacking daily. Very painful. Not as painful, though, as to the outcome of my bike. The frame took a decent whack when it hit the side of the embankment. Unfortunately, it's been declared a statuary write-off. Thanks to Paul Simonson and Frank for collecting the bike and to Ben and Bill for taking me to the hospital at Bairnsdale. Also thanks for your calls. Hope to be back soon.

Email from **Ron Johnston** after last Sunday's ride to Greendale: "When we left Bacchus Marsh, not only did the zip on my wind jacket shit itself, but the back wheel collapsed a right hand side wheel bearing, I didn't find out what the problem was until I got home. It was making a terrible noise. I stopped three times to see if I could find what it was. No go. I nearly got my son to pick me up with the car and trailer at the back of the airport. The only thing left of the bearing was the outer race and the balls."
