Club Membership stands at a very healthy 87 after three months of renewals, up three this month. Welcome to new member **Dave Humphries** riding a Suzuki Bandit 1200. He has been on two rides recently and one 21 years ago! So that makes three rides. We also welcome **Michael MacRae** on a Honda CBR600 – the noisy one. He has been on enough rides now that we offer free advice – fix your exhaust so that we can see the brake light – and he did. **Dave Williams**, formerly CBR600, now Aprilia RSV4 also rejoined after a few years off. We wish them many safe and happy rides.

The **Club web site** at *www.melbsportsbike.net.au* accumulated **637** hits during **September**, down 365 on last month. August was a freaky month with very high attendances. Total site visits are **77,815** since April 1996. The counters on the other pages after another month indicate that the 2012 Ride Calendar page took **500** hits (total **24,742** since 28th October 2008) and Great Roads **83** hits (total **6158**). All counters are significantly down – closer to the average – compared to the spike in August.

For <u>September</u> the official kilometres (sum of ride lengths) for the month is **1,952 km** (up 496 km on last month). Official Club kilometres for the month (people x ride length) is **31,974**, up 5,185 km on last month. All figures are up, consistent with five rides in the calendar month.

The average calendar yearly total is 336,393 km since 2005. This year we are up to **259,917** km with a total of seventeen crashes (up two this month). Luckily, both crashes were very minor in nature with no injuries sustained and all the bikes able to be ridden away. See articles for more info.
