## Eildon Lookout Sunday 21st July 2013

Five minutes to ten and I'm the only one here. I'm starting to think I'm at the wrong start point so I phone Barb to check the magazine - it was Whittlesea wasn't it? Yep. Ah, here they come: 1,2,3,4.

The weather is cold but sunny. Forecast was cool with possible showers in the afternoon, which didn't eventuate. I give a rough and ready route explanation because everyone here knows the drill and soon we are ready to go. Hello! A late arrival, Dave Byrne, and he needs fuel. We head off leaving Dave to catch us at Yea.

Heading up the hill I was flashed by a four wheel drive. Possible police ahead but likely spots arrive and depart with no sign and we get almost into Kinglake West and there it is: a camera car parked on the left. I flash the next few oncoming cars a warning with the pass button. A couple acknowledge; the rest don't.

We press on to Flowerdale, turn and pick up the pace to Strath Creek, then right towards Trawool and right at the Highway to Yea. Break up will be Kinglake West but we say our goodbyes here and depart for home. I arrive home around 5:20pm in time for the 5:30pm World Superbikes at Moscow Raceway in Russia.
